to get the light bulb right?”

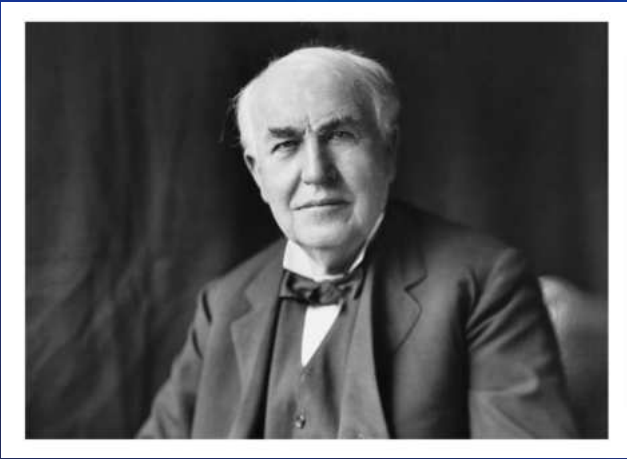
**Q. How many tries do you think it took?**

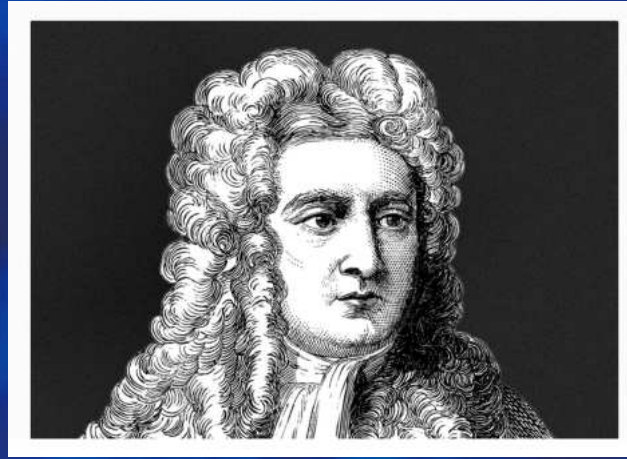

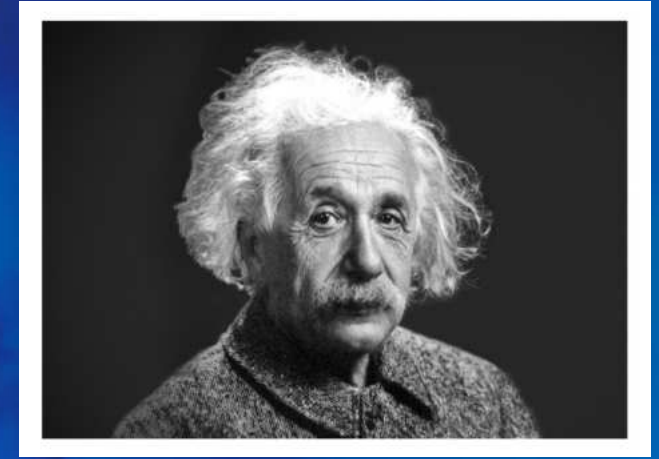

## **Read the following short synopsis of Back to the Future The Musical.**

# EIGHTIES OR FIFTIES?

**1) Divide the class into two groups.**

**2) Give one half of the class the Back to the Eighties Handout (Section 1: p.18) and the other half of the class Back to the Fifties Handout (Section 1: p.19)**

**3) Let them read, highlight and discuss the contextual information of the handout for 10 minutes.**

**4) The teacher will read out the following statements and students must stand up and say either “eighties” or “fifties,” depending on which decade they think the statement applies to. The teacher begins the activity by saying, “We are going to play ‘Eighties or Fifties.’ I’ll show you an image and read a statement, then you stand and say either “eighties” or “fifties” depending on which decade you think is correct.**

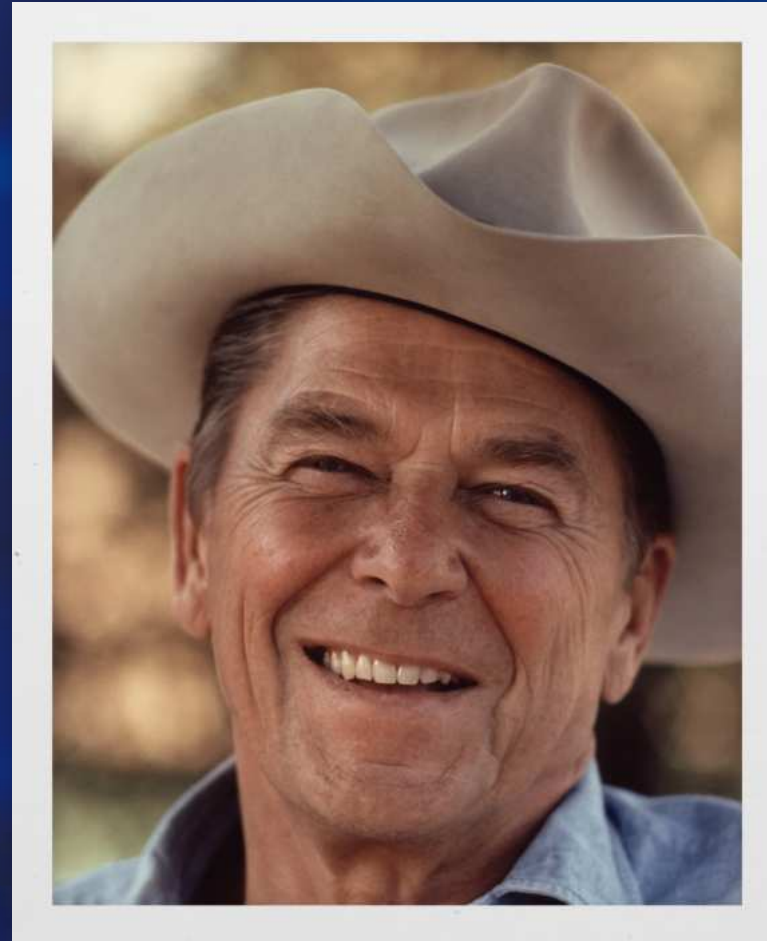
